# **Our Essential Agreements**

Each class will develop Essential Agreements based on Learner Profile characteristics (see <a href="https://www.ibo.org/myib/digitaltoolkit/files/pdfs/learner-profile-en.pdf">https://www.ibo.org/myib/digitaltoolkit/files/pdfs/learner-profile-en.pdf</a> for more information). Our 1st grade teachers will use positive reinforcement to encourage great behavior choices!

Each 1st grade class will use an exciting program called "ClassMates". Students who follow the behavior expectations defined by the IB attributes and attitudes will have the opportunity to earn "IB Stars" that will help them to earn rewards each week. children are very excited about earning "IB Starts" and you will hear them speak about it a lot at home! Please reward their good behavior with loads of positive praise!

#### **Behavior Infractions**

After a verbal warning, most students will choose to improve their behavior. If the behavior continues, students will receive behavior infractions for the following:

- Being disrespectful to a teacher/classmate (noted as B-inf—DR(T/C)
- 2. Disrupting the learning environment (noted as B-inf—DLE)
- 3. Choosing not to obey (noted as B-inf-CNO)
  Behavior infractions will be recorded in the agenda on the day is was given and in the front of the agenda on the Weekly Report pages. You will need to sign both areas of the agenda. Two behavior infractions in a week will result in loss of Choice Day at Friday PE. Four behavior infractions in a week will result in an office referral.

#### **Responsibility Infractions**

Students will receive responsibility infractions for the following:

- 1. Failure to return homework on time.
- 2. Failure to have agenda signed each night.
- 3. Failure to come to school prepared (in full uniform, with agenda, etc.).
- 4. Failure to have an infraction from the previous day signed in the front weekly report.
- 5. Failure to have the previous week's weekly report signed before returning to school the following week.

We ask that you assist by reinforcing our expectations at home and by discussing any concerns with your child, especially warnings and infractions that are recorded in the agenda.
